WANEP further condemns violence against women in all its forms and ramifications, manifesting at the interpersonal, community, structural and family levels as sexual abuse, rape, gang violence, gender-based violence among others. WANEP draws attention to the unbearable economic, psychological and emotional stress women and girls undergo due to the effects of violence and security challenges such as violent extremism which increases women's vulnerability as victims.

WANEP reiterates the call for inclusive leadership that allows for men and women to work together to make the gender equality a reality.
