ACCRA-GHANA- The West Africa Network for Peacebuilding (WANEP) on October 20, 2019 commenced a five-day training on Gender and Peacebuilding for 11 peace practitioners from the African Union(AU), PBF-Niger and WANEP national office. The training, which is holding at the Sunlodge Hotel in Accra-Ghana is under the auspices of the West Africa Peacebuilding Institute (WAPI) of WANEP.This 2019 specialised WAPI is being organised within the framework of WANEP's partnership with the African Union based on a request from the AU

Mrs. Levinia Addae-Mensah, Program Director/ Deputy Executive Director in her welcome remarks stated that the training comes not only as a reaffirmation of the value WANEP places on its partnership with the African Union (AU)

but also its commitment to ensuring the effective promotion and implementation of the UNSCR 1325.

She stated that the idea of incorporating gender perspectives into (post-conflict) peacebuilding and conflict prevention initiatives at Continental, Regional and National Levels remains a primary preoccupation of WANEP, adding "at WANEP, we believe that a clear distinction of the experiences of men, women, girls and boys, is crucial hence the prioritization of Gender in our programming".

"The mix of participants representing International, Continental and Civil Society Organisations, I believe will ensure that the effective implementation of engendered programmes in a sustainable manner. It provides an opportunity to understand each other's needs in terms of Application of gender concepts in our day to day activities and will therefore facilitate knowledge exchange and mutual learning."
